Affectionately known as "Maman Monique," this amazing woman shared her stories, her vision, and herself with so many eager listeners. Her colleague Mme Henriette Kibadi was unable to come because the US consul refused to give her a visa. What a disappointment: but... next time!

The first event on Maman Monique's calendar was an appearance at the African Soirée of our sister non-profit, United Front Against Riverblindness (UFAR), on March 1. This included a wonderful African Market displaying beautiful items made by Woman, Cradle of Abundance. Highlights include reunions with Susan Lidstone, Barbara Figge Fox, and Nancy Beatty, and special supporters from Princeton United Methodist Church, including Vasanth & Susan Victor, Mathew & Malini Ireland, and Anne Fikaris.

The centerpiece of Mme Monique's visit was her role as a keynote speaker at the 2nd African Women Extraordinaire = AWE symposium, at Princeton Seminary on March 6. A marvelous event! The theme was "Church, Health, & Women's Development." Sponsored by PTS's Dept. of Continuing Education and Dr. McKee's class on Women in African Christianity, the day-long conference drew about 50 participants from a wide region: NY & PA as well as NJ.

Mme Monique's lecture on "Congolese Women Against Violence, Poverty, & HIV/AIDS" brought tears to our eyes and fired the hearers' imaginations to get involved: a research project by one and eager plans by others to share with friends.



March was busy! Mme Monique spoke with groups and individuals. Central Presbyterian in NYC welcomed her on March 16 for a moving presentation on "Hope in the Midst of Trials." Dean Deborah Blanks invited Mme Monique to speak at Murray Dodge Hall at Princeton University to a gathering which included both students and staff.

Now they had an opportunity to hear her stories, become better acquainted, and initiate an ongoing relationship with Woman, Cradle of Abundance. students asked very intelligent questions; a The conversation with three bright 8th-graders who stayed to talk after the presentation was an extra treat. # **NEWS from CONGO**

An immediate concern of Woman, Cradle of Abundance DRC is finding means for to pay for state exams to enable the high school students they support to graduate. This year they have 123 students, mostly divided between elementary and secondary school; 8 are in the final year. Generous friends, led by Joseph & Jennifer Williams & the Rev. Lauren Carrington (Ebenezer Baptist Church, New Brunswick) are helping these seniors graduate into a hope-filled future. But suddenly an urgent problem! One student is missing!

Solomon, an orphan who drives a motorcycle "taxi" to be able to feed himself & his brother, was unjustly arrested. He delivered a passenger, who pushed him down and stole the cycle. Solomon's boss put him in prison: only because he did not prevent the theft! Prison is a death sentence in the DRC: prisoners starve unless friends buy their way in to bring food. Mme Monique is working to free Solomon – money is needed for lawyers. Please help!
