### A Tractor for FEBA!!! You did it! We did it! A dream come true! WE ARE SO GRATEFUL!!!!

COVID's destruction of life & the economy has made finding sufficient food critical. Maman Monique expanded FEBA's farm in the rural land around Kinshasa & dreamed of making it more productive. But plowing 25 acres by handhoe (traditional women's work) is impossible. Renting a tractor has not worked: too few tractors, too much competition, & even when FEBA has a reservation for plowing at a specific time, it has been bumped down the line & forced to lose a significant part of a growing season.

So owning a tractor became imperative. This allows FEBA to plant at the right time, & renting out the tractor will bring income & serve the rural neighbors.



Originally it was intended to get a used tractor for \$15000 but it was possible to buy a brand new one for \$19000, so FEBA will have many years of use ahead. Accessories & transport were more expensive than anticipated - \$12000, but you have all lived out Matt. 25: feeding the hungry. We can't thank you enough!

## Update on Congo

As new variants of COVID spread in the USA, nations in the global south are struggling to get any vaccines at all. In Congo, which last year registered only a tiny fraction of deaths from the virus, the numbers are now growing, with no vaccines in sight for 99% of the population.

But more seriously, the economic toll of the pandemic is continuing to rise, & more & more people are dying of easily preventable causes. That is, easily preventable if they had adequate food & access to & money to buy the most ordinary medicines. Deaths among our partner communities: family & friends & members, are weighing down their spirits & breaking their hearts, not to mention emptying their last reserves.

Burying the dead with honor is a sacred duty. That means paying final hospital bills, buying a casket & grave clothes, paying for a plot of land & transport for the body, & providing some kind of hospitality for the mourners. We have tried to help with this for burial of Maman Jeannette's sister, Maman Monique's sister, husbands of other FEBA members, but there are still more. Survivors of rape in the village near Uvira still suffer, even as the community gives thanks for the women's farm which means they no longer must risk violence to be able to eat.
