Faithfulness in the Worst of Times

COVID-19 is continuing to spread in Congo, though the totals are as yet quite low by comparison with the USA & Europe, thanks in good part to stay-at-home orders. The further evolution of the pandemic is uncertain, as Congo gradually re-opens.

Everyone is ordered to wear masks & FEBA has recently made 25000 for a medical NGO. (This was done basically at cost; 25 cents per mask only covers transportation & lunch for the workers, but FEBA wants to serve.)

This good news about COVID has another side: dreadful effects on health & economy from the enforced stay-home orders. Those who have obeyed have risked death by starvation... & starvation has won. The morgues in Kinshasa are full – though relatively few are virus victims. Most are people who have collapsed from hunger, or died of minor complaints because they had no resistance.

Maman Mbombo Véronique has been a vital presence in the community, an active member of FEBA & her church, a source of help to many. This week she died very suddenly, after only a few days of illness. There is no sign that it was COVID (though that cannot be ruled out), but she was “well” one day & gone three days later. There is shock. There is sadness. There is anxiety about burying her. Funerals are a major expression of cultural honor & religious piety, & families will do everything in their power to bury a loved one decently. Most of the time that means taking up a collection from all willing friends & neighbors. FEBA is contributing for Mbombo Véronique... contributing from its scarce pennies.



The (barely) living members of FEBA are the primary concern. The corn & cassava from FEBA’s farm have been used up & the new harvest will not be ready until late July, so food must be bought, even though prices are high. Emergency funds from the US were sent on June 10 to buy more food, which was distributed on June 13 & 15. The women came to Maman Monique’s home in small groups. Each received 7 kilos of corn (above) & 9 kilos of cassava (below: a much heavier root crop), to help her family through another month – if they are careful. They cried. “Thank you so much for this manna!”
