Women's Day in Eastern Congo: a Triumph of Faith and Courage



As you know, our sisters in eastern Congo live in "the worst place in the world to be a woman," as the militias keep Kivu province in a state of war. See the story in our Winter newsletter 2015. Hundreds of women & girls have been raped. Yet by their faith & courage, & the help we send through their community non-profit (CENEDI), these women have found the strength to go on with their lives. Rape is not only physical destruction; it is social death because often the victims are rejected by husbands or families. With great skill CENEDI has provided

DRC Political & Economic Challenges & Consequences

The current political situation in the DR CONGO is increasingly unstable. President Joseph Kabila is trying to change the constitution so that he can run for a third term, or delay the elections scheduled for Nov. 2016. Opposition parties & candidates are struggling to hold the government to the schedule; there have been protests, unrest, & violence.

The economic situation has been very adversely affected by both the political tensions & the unusually severe weather of the past months. Each year the global climate change has caused more havoc in the seasons in Congo. Particularly the heavy rains have destroyed property & caused trade to drop off; people cannot get to market to sell, they cannot afford to buy, yet prices (especially for imported goods) rise astronomically. Woman, Cradle of Abundance cannot sell its products; prices for materials to build the Women's Center continue to skyrocket.
